

ORDINANCE NO. 2700

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RIVIERA BEACH, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE VI, DIVISION 3, OF SECTION 2-100 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF RIVIERA BEACH, FLORIDA, RELATING TO RATES OF PAY AND SALARY SCHEDULE BY INCREASING THE SALARY OF ADMINISTRATIVE, SUPERVISORY AND CONFIDENTIAL EMPLOYEES, PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVIERA BEACH, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA as follows:

SECTION 1: That Section 2-100 of Chapter 2, Article VI, Division 3, of Code of Ordinances of Riviera Beach, relating to rates of pay and salary schedule be amended by increasing the salary of Administrative, Supervisory and Confidential employees as follows:

- (a) That the maximum of the 1994-1995 pay schedule be adjusted by three (3%) percent hereto attached.
- (b) That for the 1995-'96 Fiscal year, the Employer will adjust the individual employee's 1994-'95 wages by three (3%) percent if employed prior to October 1, 1995. There will be no further wage adjustments during the 1995-'96 Fiscal year.
- (c) That the three (3%) percent be paid retroactive to October 1, 1995
- (d) That eligibility for retroactive pay requires that employees must have been employed on the date retroactivity is paid.

SECTION 2: This Ordinance shall take effect upon its final passage and adoption by the City Council.

ORDINANCE NO. 2705

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RIVIERA BEACH, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE FUTURE LAND USE MAP IN THE CITY OF RIVIERA BEACH COMPREHENSIVE PLAN BY ASSIGNING THE FUTURE LAND USE DESIGNATION OF "COMMERCIAL" TO CERTAIN PARCELS OF LAND LOCATED AT THE NORTHWEST AND SOUTHWEST CORNER OF OLD DIXIE HIGHWAY AND WEST 10TH STREET; DIRECTING THE CITY CLERK TO UPDATE THE FUTURE LAND USE MAP; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the State of Florida "Local Government Comprehensive Planning and Land Development Regulation Act" of 1985 provides procedures to amend the adopted Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, Block 1, Lots 1-4, inclusive and Block 18, Lots 1-6, 31-36, inclusive, Plat of Inlet City have been assigned the Commercial General zoning designation; and

WHEREAS, on April 11, 1996, the Planning and Zoning Board, sitting as the Local Planning Agency, reviewed the proposed change at a Public Hearing, and forwarded a recommendation to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council sitting as the Local Governing Body, reviewed the request and recommendations and conducted a Public Hearing and second reading of this ordinance; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Florida Statutes 163.3187 (c), entitled "small scale amendments," the City shall transmit this amendment to the Florida Department of Community Affairs for review and comment.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF RIVIERA BEACH, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Future Land Use Map in the Riviera Beach Comprehensive Plan is hereby amended to assign the Riviera Beach "Commercial" future land use designation to the parcels of land legally described as follows:

LOTS 1-7, INCLUSIVE, BLOCK 1 AND LOTS 1-6, 31-36, INCLUSIVE, BLOCK 18 OF THE PLAT OF INLET CITY, ACCORDING TO THE PLAT THEREOF, AS RECORDED IN PLAT BOOK 7, AT PAGE 27, OF THE PUBLIC RECORDS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA. LESS AND EXCEPT RIGHT-OF-WAY FOR STATE ROAD S-811 (OLD DIXIE HIGHWAY) AS SHOWN ON RIGHT-OF-WAY MAP ROAD PLAT BOOK 3, PAGE 193. SUBJECT TO EASEMENTS, RESTRICTIONS, RESERVATIONS AND RIGHTS OF WAY OF RECORD. CONTAINING: 31,832 SQUARE FEET OF 0.73 ACRES OF LAND, MORE OR LESS.

SECTION 2. The Director of the Department of Community Development and Environmental Control (CDEC) is hereby authorized and directed to reflect these

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RIVIERA BEACH, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 31 "ZONING" OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES BY ASSIGNING CG: GENERAL COMMERCIAL ZONING TO 0.7 OF AN ACRE OF LAND LOCATED ON THE NORTH SIDE OF WEST 10TH STREET AND APPROXIMATELY 100 FEET WEST OF OLD DIXIE HIGHWAY; DIRECTING THE CITY CLERK TO UPDATE THE CITY'S ZONING MAP; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 166.041 of the Florida Statutes provides procedures to amend the Zoning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, legal notice and review procedures were followed in accordance with Section 166.041 (3) (c), Florida Statutes, which provides procedures for amendments affecting less than 5% of the City's total land area; and

WHEREAS, on April 11, 1996, the Planning and Zoning Board, sitting as the Local Planning Agency, reviewed the proposed zoning change at a Public Hearing, and forwarded recommendations to the City Council.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF RIVIERA BEACH, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Chapter 31, "Zoning" of the Riviera Beach Code of Ordinances is amended by assigning CG (General Commercial) zoning to the parcel of land legally described as follows:

LOTS 5-7 INCLUSIVE, OF THE PLAT OF INLET CITY, ACCORDING TO THE PLAT THEREOF, AS RECORDED IN PLAT BOOK 7, AT PAGE 27, OF THE PUBLIC RECORDS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA. SUBJECT TO EASEMENTS, RESTRICTION, RESERVATIONS AND RIGHTS OF WAY OF RECORD.

SECTION 2. The City Clerk is authorized and directed to amend the City's official Zoning Map in accordance with the changes effected under this Ordinance.

SECTION 3. If any word, phrase, clause, subsection or section of this Ordinance is for any reason held unconstitutional or invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect the validity of any remaining portions of the Ordinance.

SECTION 4. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effective immediately upon its passage and adoption.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVIERA BEACH, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 31, "ZONING" OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES BY ASSIGNING CG - GENERAL COMMERCIAL ZONING TO A CERTAIN 0.7 ACRE PARCEL OF LAND AT 105 BROADWAY; BY ASSIGNING RO - RECREATIONAL/OPEN SPACE ZONING TO A CERTAIN 10 ACRE PARCEL OF LAND AT 6188 MILITARY TRAIL; ASSIGNING IG - GENERAL INDUSTRIAL ZONING TO A CERTAIN 1.1 ACRE PARCEL OF LAND AT 4700 DYER BOULEVARD; ASSIGNING IL - LIMITED INDUSTRIAL TO A CERTAIN 0.6 OF AN ACRE PARCEL OF LAND AT 7071 MILITARY TRAIL; AND BY ASSIGNING IG - GENERAL INDUSTRIAL ZONING TO A CERTAIN 2.0 ACRE PARCEL OF LAND AT 7446 EAST INDUSTRIAL WAY; DIRECTING THE CITY CLERK TO UPDATE THE CITY'S ZONING MAP; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Chapter 166, *Florida Statutes (FS)*, provides procedures to amend the City's zoning regulations; and

WHEREAS, legal notice and review procedures were followed in accordance with Chapter 166, FS, which provides procedure for zoning map amendments affecting less than five percent of the City's total land area; and

WHEREAS, all parcels of land annexed into the City of Riviera Beach need to be assigned a City zoning classification; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 163, FS, requires the City Zoning Map to be consistent with the Future Land Use Map in the City's adopted Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Board, sitting as the Local Planning Agency, reviewed the petitioners' requests for proposed zoning at a public hearing and forwarded a recommendation to the City Council.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVIERA BEACH, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, THAT:

Section 1. The Zoning Map for the City of Riviera Beach, Florida, which has been adopted as part of Chapter 31, "Zoning" of the *Riviera Beach Code of Ordinances* is hereby amended by assigning appropriate zoning to five parcels of land described as follows:

- Parcel 1. Seven tenths of an acre at 105 Broadway. Rezone to CG - General Commercial. Section 33, Township 42, Range 43 S. 150 ft. of E. 200 ft. Of SW 1/4 of SE 1/4 W of R1W of SR4.
- Parcel 2. Ten acres at 6188 Military Trail. Rezone to RO - Recreational/Open Space. The north one quarter (N 1/4) of the south one half (S 1/2) of the southeast one quarter (SE 1/4) of Section 36, Township 42, Range 42, Palm Beach County, Florida; Less however the east 1304.29 ft. thereof.
- Parcel 3 One and one tenths acres at 4700 Dyer Boulevard. Rezone to IG - General Industrial. A parcel of land in Township 42, south, Range 42 east, Palm Beach County, Florida. The subject parcel, recorded as Marapat No. 1 Condo located I the north one-half (N 1/2) of the south one-half (S 1/2) of the north one-half (N 1/2) of the northwest one-quarter (NW 1/4) of Section 36.

Parcel 4 Six tenths of an acre of land at 7071 Military Trail. Rezone to IL - Limited Industrial. A parcel of land recorded in the Official Record Book 3192, Page 832. Said parcel is described as lot 701.1 located in the southwest one quarter (SW 1/4) of Section 25, Township 42 south, Range 42 east.

Parcel 5 Two acres of land at 7446 East Industrial Way. Rezone to IG - General Industrial. The northwest corner of said section 30, and run S 86°59'37" E on the north line of said section 30 a distance of 1244.67 feet, thence run S 2°19'24" W a distance of 279-.32 feet to the northwest corner and point of beginning of the parcel.

Section 2. The City Clerk is authorized and directed to amend the City's official Zoning Map in accordance with the changes effected under this Ordinance.

Section 3. If any word, phrase, clause, subsection or section of this Ordinance is for any reason held unconstitutional or invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect the validity of any remaining portions of the Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RIVIERA BEACH, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE VI, DIVISION 3, OF SECTION 2-100 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF RIVIERA BEACH, FLORIDA, RELATING TO RATES OF PAY AND SALARY SCHEDULE BY INCREASING THE SALARY OF GENERAL EMPLOYEES REPRESENTED BY THE NATIONAL CONFERENCE OF FIREMEN & OILERS COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT; PROVIDING AND EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVIERA BEACH, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA as follows:

SECTION 1. That Section 2-100 of Chapter 2, Article VI, Division 3, of the Code of Ordinances of Riviera Beach, relating to rates of pay and salary schedule be amended by increasing the salary of certain general employees represented by the National Conference of Firemen and Oilers Collective Bargaining Agreement as follows:

(a) All bargaining unit employees shall receive a three (3%) percent adjustment to their wages. This wage increase will be retroactive to October 1, 1995. An employee must be employed on the date of ratification to be eligible for retroactivity. An employee hired subsequent to October 1, 1995 will only receive retroactive pay to the initial date of employment.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its final passage and adoption by the City Council.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RIVIERA BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 31, ZONING, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES BY AMENDING THE CITY'S LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS FOR RESIDENTIAL PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENTS; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 166.041 of the Florida Statutes provides procedures to amend the Zoning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the City does not currently specify development regulations for duplex units in residential planned unit developments; and

WHEREAS, duplex residential units are compatible with the current uses allowed in residential planned unit developments; and

WHEREAS, legal notice and review procedures were followed in accordance with Section 166.041 (3) (a), Florida Statutes, which provides procedures for municipal ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Board conducted a public hearing and reviewed the amendments to the City's zoning regulations contained in this ordinance, and forwarded a recommendation to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council reviewed the request and recommendations of City Staff and the Planning and Zoning Board at a Public Hearing held in accordance with Section 166.041, Florida Statutes.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF RIVIERA BEACH, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Section 31-495, entitled "Property development standards for the R-PUD(1) residential planned unit developments," in Chapter 31 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows, wherein the underlined text represents new text to added and text that is struck through represents text to be deleted:

- (1) Single-family detached:
 - e. Minimum building setbacks:
Front: ~~15~~ 20 feet (ten feet for a side entrance garage).

- (2) Cluster housing (patio and zero lot line only):
 - e. Minimum building setbacks:
Front: ~~15~~ 20 feet (ten feet for a side entrance garage when lot width is 48 feet minimum).

(3) Townhouses or duplexes:	<u>Townhomes</u>	<u>Duplexes</u>
a. Minimum lot size:	1,800 sq. ft.	<u>2,400 sq. feet.</u>
b. Minimum lot width:	24 feet.	<u>24 feet.</u>
c. Maximum building height:	35 feet.	<u>35 feet.</u>
d. Minimum floor area:	800 sq. ft.	<u>800 sq. ft.</u>
e. Minimum setbacks:		
Front:	15 <u>20</u> feet.	<u>20 feet.</u>
Side:	7.5 feet.	<u>6 feet.</u>
Rear:	15 feet.	<u>15 feet.</u>
f. Length of buildings:		
The total length of each structure shall not exceed six units.		
No more than four consecutive units shall have the same front setbacks or front building line.		

SECTION 2. It is the intention of the City Council and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Riviera Beach, Florida, and the sections of this ordinance may be renumbered to accomplish such intentions.

SECTION 3. If any word, phrase, clause, subsection or section of this Ordinance is for any reason held unconstitutional or invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect the validity of any remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. That all sections or parts of sections of the Code of Ordinances, all ordinances or parts of ordinances, and all resolutions or parts of resolutions, in conflict herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed to extent of such conflict.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon adoption.





ORDINANCE NO. 2711

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RIVIERA BEACH REPEALING CURRENT SECTION 10-149 CLASSIFICATION AND RATE STRUCTURE AND THE ADOPTION OF A NEW OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE TAX CLASSIFICATION AND RATE STRUCTURE FOR SECTION 10-149 PURSUANT TO FLORIDA STATUTE SECTION 205.0535 "RECLASSIFICATION AND RATE STRUCTURE REVISING."

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 192-94 was passed and adopted November 2, 1994 by the City Council of Riviera Beach appointing an Equity Study Commission to develop classification and rate structure for the city.

WHEREAS, The Equity Study Commission has completed the task and submitted a report of its recommendations.

WHEREAS, The implementation of the Equity Study Commission will allow local government limited Occupation License Tax increases, reclassification and rate structure revisions.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Riviera Beach, Palm Beach County, Florida as follows:

Section 1: Ordinance No. 2682 of the City of Riviera Beach Code of Ordinance be amended by repealing the Section 10-149, "Classification and Rate Structure" of the current schedule adopted from Ordinance #2088. A new and revised "Classification and Rate Structure" be adopted pursuant to Section 205.0535, Florida Statutes, "Reclassification and Rate Structure Revising," as follows:

Article V. Occupational License Tax

Section 10-149, Classifications and Rate Structure - The occupational license classifications and fee schedule is adopted to levy an occupational license tax for the privilege of engaging or managing any business, profession or occupation within the incorporation of the City of Riviera Beach. The schedule and fee structure due to the length and context of the section, will not be codified being placed on reserve at the City Clerk's Office as follows: (see attached)

Section 2: It is the intention of the City Council and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Riviera Beach, Florida, and the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered to accomplish such intentions.

Section 3: If any word, phrase, clause, subsection or section of this Ordinance is for any reason held unconstitutional or invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect the validity of any remaining portions of this ordinance.

Section 4: That all sections or parts of sections of the Code of Ordinances, all ordinances or parts of ordinances, and all resolutions or parts of resolutions, in conflict herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed to extent of such conflict.

Section 5: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and adoption.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RIVIERA BEACH, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, FIXING THE ADJUSTED TAX VALUATION OF REAL PROPERTY LOCATED WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY; LEVYING A TAX ON REAL PROPERTY AND TANGIBLE BUSINESS PERSONAL PROPERTY LOCATED WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY, FOR FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 1996 AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 1997; FIXING THE MILLAGE RATE THEREON FOR SAID YEAR; CONTAINING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVIERA BEACH, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA:

SECTION ONE

That for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 1996 and ending September 30, 1997, the adjusted valuation on all real property and tangible business personal property within the City of Riviera Beach is hereby determined to be and is fixed as follows:

- (a) Real Property and Tangible Business Personal Property on which tax can be extended, exclusive of homestead property, \$1,357,580,411. *

* **Subject to final approval of the County Equalization Board**

SECTION TWO

That for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 1996 and ending September 30, 1997, a tax of eight point nine nine nine-seven(8.9997) mills on the dollar shall be, and is levied and shall be collected on all real property and tangible business personal property within the City of Riviera Beach, Florida, not specifically designated as homestead property or owned by the municipality and/or expressly exempted by the laws of the Constitution of the State of Florida for the purpose of raising funds for the improvements and government of the City, and for the payment of its obligations and expenses, and for the purpose of carrying out the purpose and duties granted and imposed by the City Charter and Code. Said real property and tangible business personal property being specifically set forth as Items A in Section 1 hereof and valued in the amount of \$1,357,580,411 subject to final approval of the County Equalization Board.

SECTION THREE

As provided by Section 200.065 (5) Florida Statutes, upon notification from the Property Appraiser of any aggregate change in the certified assessment roll, the City Manager is hereby authorized to certify to the Property Appraiser, within three (3) days of notification, an adjusted millage rate which shall be such that taxes computed by applying the adopted rate against the certified taxable value are equal to the taxable value on the roll to be extended.

SECTION FOUR

The proposed millage of 8.9997 represents a zero percent increase over the rolled-back millage rate.

SECTION FIVE

If any word, phrase, clause, subsection or section of this ordinance is for any reason held unconstitutional or invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect the validity of any remaining portion of this ordinance.

SECTION SIX

That all sections or parts of sections of the Code of Ordinances, all ordinances or parts of ordinances and all resolutions or parts of resolutions, in conflict herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed to extent of such conflict.

SECTION SEVEN

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and adoption.

This ordinance shall be effective upon its passage by the City Council and shall not be delivered to the Municipal Code Corporation for inclusion in the Code Book.





Sec. 20-74. Standby service charges.

The regular minimum charge, readiness-to-serve, remains the same for water and sewer service while the water is turned off, plus a ~~(\$6.24)~~ (\$10.00) turn-off charge. When service is resumed, there is a turn-on charge of ~~(\$6.24)~~ (\$10.00). Standby charges for the full number of units are effective upon requesting water and/or sewer service.

Sec. 20-75. Testing of meters.

The department of utilities shall have the right to test meters to determine their accuracy whenever it deems such action advisable. In addition, a user may demand a field test when in his judgment the meter is not operating correctly. The consumer shall pay a fee of ~~(\$15.00)~~ (\$30.00) for three fourths and one inch meters, and for all other meters the charge is the actual cost incurred for such field test. AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVIERA BEACH, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, EXEMPTING QUALIFIED BUSINESSES IN THE RIVIERA BEACH ENTERPRISE ZONE FROM PAYING EITHER ONE-HALF OR ALL OF THE CITY'S TEN PERCENT UTILITY TAX ON ELECTRICITY FOR A FIVE-YEAR PERIOD; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Riviera Beach, Florida, has established that economic development of distressed areas is a public purpose and that local residents and the private sector should be encouraged and assisted to revitalize such areas; and

WHEREAS, in July 1995, the State of Florida designated a portion of the City of Riviera Beach as a state enterprise zone in order to provide various state tax incentives to encourage economic development in the enterprise zone; and

WHEREAS, the City of Riviera Beach has determined that to increase the potential of employment of the residents in the enterprise zone, it is necessary to maximize the tax incentives for business development in the enterprise zone; and

WHEREAS, Section 166.231(8)(a), Florida Statutes, provide that a municipality may adopt an ordinance exempting qualified businesses in a state enterprise zone from paying either 50 % or 100 % of the municipal utility tax on electricity used by such businesses.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVIERA BEACH, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, THAT:

Section 1. The City Council hereby exempts qualified businesses in the Riviera Beach Enterprise Zone from paying 50% of the City utility tax on electricity, pursuant to Section 212.08(15), Florida Statutes. The Riviera Beach Enterprise Zone is illustrated in Exhibit A, and may be amended from time to time.

Section 2. The City Council hereby exempts qualified businesses in the Riviera Beach Enterprise Zone, that have 20% or more of their employees residing in an enterprise zone, from paying 100% of the City utility tax on electricity, pursuant to Section 212.08(15), Florida Statutes.

Section 3. The City Council commits to implement the utility tax exemption for electrical energy used in the enterprise zone according to Section 212.08, Florida Statutes, and the following restrictions:

1. The utility tax credit will only be available to qualified businesses located in the enterprise zone;
2. The term "qualified business" is defined in Section 212.08(15)(f), Florida Statutes;
3. The utility tax credit may only be carried forwarded by a qualified business for a period of five years;
4. Proof of compliance concerning the employment requirements must be forwarded to the State Department of Revenue. Upon approval, the State Department of Revenue is responsible for notifying the Florida Power and Light Company to exempt the business from payment of 50 % of the utility sales tax.

Section 4. The City of Riviera Beach Department of Community Development and Environmental Control shall forward a certified copy of this adopted ordinance to the State of Florida Department of Revenue in Tallahassee, Florida, in accordance with Section 166.231(8)(a), Florida Statutes.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect on November 1, 1996.

ORDINANCE NO. 2720

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RIVIERA BEACH, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, BE AMENDED BY INCREASING THE SALARY OF UNIFORM FIRE PERSONNEL REPRESENTED BY THE RIVIERA BEACH ASSOCIATION OF FIREFIGHTERS COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVIERA BEACH, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA as follows:

SECTION 1. That the Fire salary schedule be amended by increasing the salary of certain uniform fire personnel represented by the Riviera Beach Association of Firefighters Collective Bargaining Agreement as follows:

(a) All firefighters bargaining unit employees shall receive a three percent (3%) adjustment to their wages. This wage increase will be retroactive to October 1, 1995. An employee must be employed on the date of ratification to be eligible for retroactivity. An employee hired subsequent to October 1, 1995 will only receive retroactive pay to the initial date of employment. The maximum of the pay grade will be increased by (3%).

The parties will create a committee consisting of two representatives each from both the Union and the City to discuss methods of addressing the issue of employee location on the salary schedule. The committee shall render a report no later than January 15, 1997.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its final passage and adoption by the City Council.
