
















PATROL

The backbone of law enforcement in Riviera Beach, the Road Patrol Division is structured into three distinct geographical police districts, ensuring comprehensive coverage and rapid response capabilities around the clock, every day of the year. These districts are strategically positioned to effectively serve the diverse needs of our community.

Within these districts, our dedicated uniformed patrol officers are the frontline responders to approximately 75,000 calls each year. Whether it's a report of a crime in progress, a traffic accident, or a community concern, our officers are trained to swiftly assess situations and take appropriate action to maintain public safety.

Their duties extend beyond just responding to emergencies. Our officers actively engage in traffic enforcement efforts, ensuring compliance with laws and regulations to enhance road safety for all residents and visitors. Moreover, community policing initiatives are integral to their daily activities. By building trust and fostering positive relationships with the community, our officers work collaboratively to address local issues and concerns, ultimately promoting a safer and more cohesive neighborhood environment.

TRAFFIC


The primary role of the Riviera Beach Police Department Traffic Enforcement Unit is to uphold both the traffic laws of the State of Florida and all ordinances concerning traffic within the city limits. This enforcement is crucial for ensuring the safety and security of all individuals traveling on Riviera Beach roadways.

This specialized unit plays a vital role within the Police Department by providing support to the Patrol Division. Traffic enforcement officers handle all traffic-related matters, thereby enabling road patrol officers to focus on their immediate patrol duties.

CROSSING GUARDS

In addition to the efforts of our traffic enforcement officers, the Traffic Enforcement Unit employs civilian Community Service Aides (CSAs) who play a critical role in managing traffic incidents, particularly crashes.

Moreover, our team of crossing guards serves as a vital component of our commitment to pedestrian safety, especially for the youngest members of our community. These vigilant crossing guards are stationed at key intersections along school routes, ensuring the safe passage of children as they travel to and from school.







K-9 UNIT

The K-9 Unit comprises four dogs, with two trained in narcotics detection and all trained in apprehension work. These canine officers are not only invaluable tools but also trusted companions to their human partners. Their primary duty is to risk their lives to protect police officers when faced with danger. The officer and their K-9 undergo extensive training, including a rigorous 420-hour inservice course that demands dedication.

These highly trained dogs are utilized for various tasks, including building searches, area searches, narcotic detection, article searches, and vehicle searches. Their presence serves as a constant reminder of the importance of officer safety.



MARINE

The Marine Unit upholds State, Local, and Municipal laws, ensuring safety on the water. Their duties include enforcing safety regulations, providing rescue assistance, and investigating derelict vessels. They also oversee activities like water skiing, jet skiing, swimming, and fishing, ensuring the safety of all participants. Additionally, they enforce conservation laws, investigate boating accidents and fatalities, and assist in locating missing persons near water bodies.

Marine patrol officers conduct a variety of tasks, including investigating accidents, inspecting boats and boaters, conducting safety checks, inspecting fish, assisting with wildlife management, drug interdiction, law enforcement, report writing, making arrests, and providing courtroom testimony.

STRATEGIC INVESTIGATIONS

The Investigation Division of the police department comprises three specialized sections: General Assignment, Crime Scene, and Vice. Each unit is staffed by highly trained, well-educated, and motivated individuals dedicated to investigating, apprehending, and incarcerating criminals.

GENERAL ASSIGNMENT

The General Assignment unit of the Investigation section handles follow-up investigations for all major crimes occurring within the jurisdiction of Riviera Beach. This encompasses crimes against property, ranging from burglaries to frauds, and crimes against persons, from simple assaults to homicides. Investigators in this section are committed to safeguarding the city's residents and their property, including children, adults, and the elderly. They collaborate closely with Crime Scene Detectives and other investigators from various agencies, both local and federal.

VICE

The Vice Unit in Riviera Beach identifies, investigates, and infiltrates street to mid-level narcotics dealers and organizations. They collaborate closely with other units in the Investigations Bureau and various law enforcement agencies. Their responsibilities extend to investigating the sale of drug paraphernalia, prostitution, lewd activity, and regulating alcoholic beverage laws.

By working with local, state, and federal agencies, they monitor and combat illegal activities. Daily citizen reports aid in their investigations. The Vice Unit effectively deters drug abusers through routine drug reverses, leading to arrests and vehicle seizures for forfeiture, imposing significant costs on offenders and dissuading them from purchasing drugs in the city.





STRATEGIC INVESTIGATIONS

CRIME SCENE

The Crime Scene unit is a critical component of the Riviera Beach Police Department, comprised of highly trained police technicians specializing in evidence collection, preservation, and documentation. Equipped with advanced skills and techniques, these technicians play a pivotal role in the investigation process.

With expertise in various methods of processing and lifting latent fingerprints, the team ensures that crucial forensic evidence is properly gathered and preserved at crime scenes. Additionally, their proficiency extends to photography, videotaping, and analyzing intricate details such as blood spatter patterns, firearms, projectiles, and shell casings.

Collaboration is key to their success. The Crime Scene unit works closely with the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office Crime Lab and other local, state, and federal agencies to leverage resources and expertise. By pooling together their collective knowledge and resources, they enhance the effectiveness of criminal investigations and contribute to the pursuit of justice in our community.

INTERNAL AFFAIRS

The Office of Internal Affairs is responsible for investigating complaints regarding Riviera Beach Police Department employees. Individuals with complaints about an employee can contact the Internal Affairs Office by phone, mail, or email.

The Riviera Beach Police Department is unwavering in its commitment to upholding the integrity of its members and preserving the trust of the community. To ensure this, the department thoroughly investigates both formal and anonymous complaints from community members and internal sources.

INVESTIGATION TYPES

The Riviera Beach Police Department conducts two types of investigations into employee misconduct: those conducted by an assigned supervisor and those conducted by the Internal Affairs Division.

Internal Affairs investigations are initiated for allegations involving criminal misconduct, corruption, brutality, or violations of civil rights. Additionally, the Internal Affairs unit investigates other complaints as directed by the Chief. Complaints related to violations of departmental rules and regulations are handled by the member's immediate supervisor or another designated supervisor within each Division's Commander





S.W.A.T.

The Riviera Beach Police Department's SWAT (Special Weapons and Tactics) unit is a highly trained and specialized team dedicated to handling high-risk situations with precision and expertise. Comprised of specially trained officers, SWAT responds to incidents such as hostage rescues, armed standoffs, and high-risk warrants. Their duties include executing tactical operations, providing crisis negotiation, and ensuring the safety of civilians and officers alike in intense and dangerous situations. SWAT plays a crucial role in maintaining public safety and upholding the law in Riviera Beach and surrounding areas.

RESERVE PROGRAM

The Riviera Beach Police Department's Reserve and Auxiliary Officer Program comprises volunteers who assist full-time sworn officers in crime prevention and law enforcement duties. They undergo similar training as full-time officers and work alongside them in emergency situations. Reserve and Auxiliary officers, often retired or certified officers, contribute to enhancing the city's quality of life. Their law enforcement background and community involvement provide valuable insight into neighborhood issues, benefiting both officers and residents.




VICTIM SERVICES

The Community-Oriented Policing Unit of the Riviera Beach Police Department is dedicated to enhancing community safety through collaboration. We prioritize cooperation and coordination of public safety efforts with all stakeholders in our city.

Establishing trust, bolstering legitimacy, and fostering cooperation are essential for community stability. This approach reinforces the integrity of our criminal justice system and ensures the delivery of effective and efficient police services.

COMMUNICATIONS

The Communications Team at Riviera Beach Police Department is a hub for police, fire, and medical communications. Our team handles both emergency and non-emergency calls, dispatching services efficiently. We manage over 100,000 calls annually, providing rapid assistance to the public and vital support to field personnel.

The mission of the Communications Section is to deliver timely assistance to the public, serving as their initial point of contact for police, fire, and medical aid. Additionally, it provides essential support to field personnel. Recognized as the frontline for community assistance, our highly skilled team takes pride in delivering exceptional service.

RECORDS


The Records Section provides diverse services to the Police Department and the public, including external agencies like the State Attorney, FBI, and other police departments. Services include fulfilling document requests, responding to subpoenas, and managing over 13,298 documents yearly. It classifies criminal offense reports, maintains crime statistics vital for internal monitoring, and shares data with the Florida Department of Law Enforcement for national crime reports.



TECHNOLOGY

Our Technology Specialist leads the way in innovation, managing the city's extensive wireless infrastructure. They serve as the main integrator for specialized IT systems, such as surveillance, evidence collection, and in-car video systems.

As a vital technical liaison between the police department and external agencies, they ensure seamless coordination with the City's IT department. This underscores our dedication to advancing law enforcement capabilities through cutting-edge technology.





CRIME ANALYSIS UNIT





- Offenses that were unfounded or referred to another jurisdiction were excluded.






PROPERTY CRIME 2013 -2023




BURGLARY INCIDENTS MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT INCIDENTS 2015




VIOLENT CRIME 2013-2023




SEXUAL ASSAULT INCIDENTS






AGGRAVATED ASSAULT INCIDENTS

HOMICIDES



There were 8 homicides in 2023, a decrease of about 27% from 11 homicides in 2022.

- Out of 8 homicides, 4 arrests were made and 1 case was cleared exceptionally as the offender ended his life. This makes the **2023** clearance rate for homicides **62.5**% so far (investigations are ongoing).
- All homicides in 2023 were the result of gun violence.
 *In 2023, 210 guns were recovered.



2023 HIGHLIGHTS & INITIATIVES

In 2023, the Riviera Beach Police Department embarked on a transformative journey aligned with our community-oriented policing model. Introducing a series of innovative initiatives, we forged stronger bonds with our community, tackled crime, and uplifted our neighborhoods.

Through initiatives such as community meetups, pill drop boxes, and the new CRA Clean and Safe team, we've made significant strides in fostering a safer and more resilient Riviera Beach. RE-LAUNCH OF THE REAL TIME CRIME CENTER

The Real Time Crime Center (RTCC) employs state-of-the-art technology to provide up-to-the-minute information, details, and analytics for crime prevention, reduction, and resolution. This includes advanced tools like License Plate Recognition (LPR), ShotSpotter technology, and live real-time camera feeds.

Furthermore, the RTCC is actively enhancing its collaboration with businesses and housing communities equipped with video surveillance.

We encourage businesses and residents interested in partnering with the Riviera Beach Police Department through our Security Camera Registration Program (SCRP) to contact the RTCC. Together, we can further strengthen community safety and security.

LIGHT OUTAGE INITIATIVE

Captain Meyer and his team, in collaboration with Florida Power and Light (FPL) and Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), began this initiative as a proactive effort to address street lighting issues in the City of Riviera Beach.



Additionally, Riviera Beach Police Department has been actively engaged in identifying missing street name signs and damaged traffic control devices. These initiatives demonstrate our commitment to enhancing safety and infrastructure within the community.





THE CLEAN AND SAFE INITIATIVE

In October, the Riviera Beach Police Department and the Riviera Beach Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) united under the leadership of Sgt. Roosevelt Lee to launch the Clean and Safe Initiative. This innovative program marks a significant collaboration aimed at improving the quality of life within the CRA District. Led by Sgt. Lee's expertise and vision, the initiative mobilizes a dedicated team of "Clean and Safe Ambassadors" alongside law enforcement officers.

Community Clean-ups

Community Meetings

CompStat Meetings

Convenient Stores Community Meetings

In the fall of 2023 the Riviera Beach Police Department partnered with Code Enforcement and Development Services to create a plan that addresses concerns surrounding convenience stores. In September we held our first meeting with community stakeholders, particularly convenience store owners, to pinpoint several issues, such as police calls for service and criminal activity in proximity to these stores.

Development Services Department provided insights into the Municipal Code of Ordinances, covering crucial areas like property maintenance, building modifications, signage, trash, and landscaping. This ongoing initiative offers a collaborative platform to address concerns collectively and explore actionable solutions.
